

This book has much needed information for the Windows XP, Vista, or Win7 user looking to upgrade to the newest version. Although it principally focuses on how to navigate non-touch devices, there are many good tips and tricks for everyone.

Migrating from Windows 7 to 8.1 seemed to be a big mistake on my part, but Dr Andy Williams

explained the rationale for the somewhat difficult and irritating User interface as well as a raft of other very useful techniques.
