


Irish Pub Cooking

I purchased this cookbook just when I was starting to cut my teeth on Irish cuisine. I could not have picked a better one. The recipes are all very simple and easy to follow with beautiful photographs to help whet your appetite while you prep!The resulting food is just fabulous, everything bit as delicious as the recipes and photos promise. Little bits of folklore and serving suggestions accompany each recipe. Every recipe I've tried from this cookbook has been easy to follow and turned out really well. It's a fairly small cookbook and definitely doesn't cover all of Irish cuisine, but to me it comes across as

what you might find in a nice restaurant's menu. Big plus is that every recipe has a photo. One thing I also really appreciate is that the ingredients generally aren't exotic, and I can find easy substitutes for the ones that are (for example, whitefish fillets in the Fisherman's Pie).

I purchased this at a discount dollar store. The layout and pictures are very appealing, and the recipes seemed simple enough. I used several of the recipes today and I have to say I'm very glad I picked up this book! I made the leek & potato soup, Colcannon, and the Potato, Leek & Chicken pie. All the ingredients are easy to come by, the instructions are clear and so far everything turned out great! I'm looking forward to making more recipes. I would recommend it to anyone wanting to try some Irish pub cuisine.
