

I was looking for Joel Skousen's book, Strategic Relocation, and came across this. I didn't want to spend the money on Skousen's book at the time, so I grabbed this instead. It's not bad for what it is. However, I feel like the work he's done could be fairly easily done by anyone on the internet. Starting with Google Maps and some Wikipedia searches, even the least informed person could figure out enough details about an area to start their search. The real value is in having someone lay out a very clear, deliberate, and thorough list of considerations you should keep in mind, with regional concerns added in (e.g. water availability in the desert, winter preparedness in the upper Midwest, etc.). This book doesn't do a great job of this. It's somewhat generic info, as I remember. It's good for someone who just clued in to the fact that the world in 2014 is not Mayberry and choosing an area for its safety as well as other factors is a good long-term plan. For the rest of us who already knew this, this resource won't provide much in the way of new information. But it's cheap, so why not?

I would recommend this book to all people concerned with prepping/preparing for a catastrophe or terrorist attack on theUnited States. I like the fact that this book listed not only information about finding work in your new community, butalso listed things such as Median Income, Average yearly rainfall, soil conditions, (i.e., radon gas) and a lot more. The book's author also gives tips for fitting in to your new community, a list of things to have at home in case of anemergency, info. about buying shelf-stable foods, etc. All in all a great read!!
